An Executive Committee (parent members) consisting of the following officers:

- a) <u>Two Co-Chairs</u>:
  - Together or alternately conduct Council meetings and oversee the activities of the Executive Committee and general Council activity. The Co-Chairs are ex-officio members of all committees established by the school Council and communicate with the principal on behalf of the Council. maintain the constitution and ensure a regular review by the council
  - communicate with the school community on a regular basis and ensure that parents/guardians of all students are consulted on matters under consideration
  - facilitate the resolution of conflicts
  - consult with senior board staff and trustees as required
  - prepare an annual report and ensure the treasurer prepares financial statements to be submitted to the principal for distribution to the school community and the OCDSB
- b) <u>Treasurer</u>:
  - Maintains accurate records of all Council financial dealings and prepares monthly and year-end reports which are to be kept available at the school for at least four years. The treasurer has signing authority on Council's bank account and monitors all fundraising initiatives undertaken by the Council.
- c) <u>Secretary</u>:
  - Prepares and distributes meeting notices, agenda, minutes and monthly newsletters which are to be kept available at the school for at least four years. Receives and distributes incoming school mail.
